The International Association of Physics Students (IAPS) is an international non-governmental association run by students for students and recent graduates who are interested in physics. The aim of the IAPS is to give physics students the opportunity to have an international scientific experience as a supplement to their university or college education. The Society of Physics Students (SPS) is a National Committee member of IAPS representing the United States of America.

This summer, IAPS will host its annual International Conference of Physics Students (ICPS) in Budapest, Hungary, from August 11-18, 2010. SPS is soliciting from its student membership proposals for physics papers to be presented at the ICPS. Up to two student papers will be selected. Expenses for transportation, room, board, and registration will be paid by SPS. Applications will be judged on the quality of the abstract, letters of recommendation, and demonstration of active participation in SPS. The conference language will be English. Typically, the attendees are upper level undergraduate, and first and second year graduate students. Previous years' conferences have been held in Turkey, Portugal, Austria, Russia, Denmark, Romania, Finland, Croatia, Ireland, and Poland.

The privilege of contributing papers is restricted to SPS members in good standing and nonmembers whose completed membership applications and payments for the first year's dues are submitted before the deadline. The application form with proposed abstract and two letters of recommendation must be sent to the SPS Outstanding Student Award Committee, One Physics Ellipse, College Park, MD 20740, postmarked on or before **March 15, 2010 (NEW DATE)**
